

For, He took pleasure in ascending the Cross in the flesh to suffer death; and to raise the dead by His glorious Resurrection.

<u>APOLYTIKION OF THE ELEVATION OF THE HOLY CROSS IN TONE ONE</u>: O Lord, save Thy people and bless Thine inheritance, granting to Thy people victory over all their enemies, and by the power of Thy Cross preserving Thy commonwealth.

<u>APOLYTIKION OF ST. MICHAEL THE ARCHANGEL</u>: O ye foremost of the heavenly host, we beseech thee, though we are unworthy. Pray that we may be encompassed with the shadow of thy unearthly glory. Preserving us who kneel and cry endlessly. Deliver us from oppression since Ye are the princes of the highest power.

THE EPISTLE

(For Sunday after the Elevation of the Holy Cross)

How magnified are Thy works, O Lord.

In wisdom hast Thou made them all. Bless the Lord, O my soul.

The Reading from the Epistle of St. Paul to the Galatians. (2:16-20)

Brethren, knowing that a person is not justified by the works of the Law, but through faith in Jesus Christ, even we have believed in Jesus Christ, that we might be justified by faith in Christ, and not by the works of the Law; for by the works of the Law shall no flesh be justified. But if, while we sought to be justified in Christ, we ourselves also were found sinners, is Christ then a minister of sin? God forbid! For if I build up again those things which I destroyed, I prove myself a transgressor. For I through the law died to the law, that I might live to God. I have been crucified with Christ, nevertheless I live, yet not I, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave Himself up for me.

THE GOSPEL

(For Sunday after the Elevation of the Holy Cross)

The Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Mark. (8:34-9:1)

The Lord said, "If any man would come after Me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow Me. For whoever would save his life will lose it; and whoever loses his life for My sake and the Gospel's will save it. For what does it profit a man, to gain the whole world and forfeit his soul? For what can a man give in return for his soul? For whoever is ashamed of Me and of My words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of him will the Son of man also be ashamed, when He comes in the glory of His Father with the holy angels." And He said to them, "Truly, I say to you, there are some standing here who will not taste death before they see the Kingdom of God come with power."

Special Fundraising Appeal

Dear Parishioners of St. Michael,

The Parish Council has been working diligently to address pressing maintenance concerns for the church. Thankfully, through the dedication of our parishioners, we have been able to apply our collective skills to many projects within our capabilities, but we have also needed to solicit and vet competitive bids for projects beyond our skills.

As you know, starting this fall, we replaced handrails on the ramp and front stairs, and painted the nave and sacristy on the interior of the church. We have now moved forward with trimming the trees overhanging the roof and parking lot, staining the shingles, ramp, handrails and painting the trim and shutters on the exterior of the church. These projects, both necessary and long overdue, present extraordinary expenses that only occur every 12-15 years.

The scope of this work is extensive: handrails, \$400; painting interior \$8,100; trimming trees, \$3,500; staining and painting exterior, \$20,500. Although we have been already able to allocate funds from our operating budget and reserves to address one-third of the nearly \$32,500 in work required, as we begin our new liturgical year, we ask for your donations to help meet these extraordinary expenses. Pledge forms are available at the church.

We appreciate your consideration and ask for your support as we continue to maintain our lovely parish!

THE SYNAXARION

On September 18 in the Holy Orthodox Church, we continue to celebrate the Elevation (Exaltation) of the Precious and Life-giving Cross, and we commemorate our Righteous Father Eumenios the wonderworker, bishop of Gortyna.

Verses

Eumenios, Gortyna's eye most gentle, hath beheld the most gracious eye of the Master. On the eighteenth, magnanimous Eumenios died.

He gave himself to Christ with his whole heart from his youth, freeing himself of the heavy burdens of riches and of the flesh. Eumenios gave all of his goods and money to the poor and needy, and fasted strictly. He thus healed himself and others. Passionless and filled with the grace of the Holy Spirit, Eumenius shone with a radiance as it is written: "A city set on a hill cannot be hid" (Matt. 5:14). As a bishop in Gortyna, holy Eumenios governed Christ's flock as a good shepherd. He worked many miracles by his prayers: he killed a poisonous snake, drove out demons, healed many of the sick, and brought rain from God in a time of drought. Eumenios entered into the eternal presence of our Lord in the seventh century.

On this day, we also commemorate the Martyr Ariadne of Phrygia. By their intercessions, O Christ God, have mercy upon us. Amen.
