

THE EPISTLE

(For Sunday of Forgiveness)

Sing praises to our God, sing praises. Clap your hands, all ye nations.

The Reading from the Epistle of St. Paul to the Romans. (13:11-14:4) Brethren, now is our salvation nearer than when we believed. The night is far spent, the day is at hand. Let us therefore cast off the works of darkness, and let us put on the armor of light. Let us walk becomingly, as in the day, not in reveling and drunkenness, not in chambering and licentiousness, not in strife and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh to fulfill its lusts. But as for the one who is weak in faith, receive him, but not for disputes over opinions. For one believes he may eat anything; but the weak person eats herbs. Let not him who eats despise him who does not eat, and let not him who does not eat judge him who eats; for God has received him. Who are you to be the judge over the servant of a stranger? To his own master he either stands or falls; but he will be made to stand; for God is able to make him stand.

THE GOSPEL

(For Sunday of Forgiveness)

The Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew. (6:14-21)

The Lord said to His Disciples: If you forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father also will forgive you; but if you do not forgive men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses. And when you fast, do not look dismal, like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces that their fasting may be seen by men. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, that your fasting may not be seen by men but by your Father Who is in secret; and your Father Who sees in secret will reward you. Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures

in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there will your

heart be also.

Beloved Hierarchs, Reverend Clergy, Archdiocesan Trustees, Department Heads, Organization Presidents, Parish Councils and Faithful of this God-protected Archdiocese:

We pray this letter finds you well as we send you this official Call to the 57^{th} Biennial Archdiocesan Convention. We would like to direct your attention to the following matters:

- ➤ The Fifty-Seventh Convention of this Archdiocese will be held at the Hyatt Regency O'Hare, Rosemont, Illinois from July 20 27, 2025. The host parish of St. George Church, Cicero, IL is working diligently to welcome us all to Chicago. All information about the convention can be accessed through the official convention website: https://www.ac2025chicago.org and through the enclosed flyer which includes important information as well. https://www.ac2025chicago.org
- ➤ All Reverend Clergy must be in Chicago no later than Monday evening July 21, 2025. The General Assembly of the Order of St. Ignatius of Antioch will be held in the morning on Tuesday, July 22nd and all members of the Order are encouraged to attend. The Department Heads and members of each department must be in Chicago by Wednesday, July 23nd, unless you have scheduled a meeting for your department and need to arrive earlier.
- ➤ The Archdiocesan Constitution specifies that each parish and mission is entitled to one voting delegate for every one hundred (100) baptized souls or fraction of one hundred which exceeds fifty (50). In addition, each fulltime pastor, and fulltime assistant pastor is eligible to one vote. You will receive, after Pascha, the proxy form and Delegate List electronically from the Department of Statistics and Credentials by email, which requests that you identify your delegates by name, and submit the form electronically no later than July 1, 2025. The voting Forms will be distributed to pastors on Tuesday, July 22nd at 10:00am in the same room as the clergy meeting. Clergy who are not present during the meeting or who "forget" to pick up the voting form will not have the possibility to do so later on.

- ➤ Your financial obligation to the Archdiocese under the Proportional Giving System for 2025 has already been established based on the forms and worksheets that you have submitted. In addition, every parish is expected to contribute according to the minimum requirements for the three special trays, which are collected throughout the year. All parishes are strongly encouraged to make sure that your payments are up to date so that your delegation may be properly seated and allowed to vote at the General Assembly which begins on Thursday morning, July 24th. Parishes who did not submit census numbers will not be able to vote.
- ➤ It is the sacred duty of all clergy and parish councils to attend the convention. It is also the sacred duty of every parish to pay their pastor's expenses so that he may attend both the diocesan Parish Life Conference, and the Archdiocese Convention. For missions who may not be able to afford these expenses, the Order of St. Ignatius can accept an application which requests some financial assistance for the pastor to attend these expenses.
- ➤ It is the policy of this Archdiocese that no resolutions may be accepted from the floor of the General Assembly. If you would like to introduce a resolution, please submit the written resolution to the Archdiocese Office in Englewood, NJ no later than June 10, 2025
- ➤ A very important part of every convention is the Convention Journal, which depends heavily on support from every community in the Archdiocese. We strongly encourage you to contribute to this journal by purchasing an ad, and that this be done without any further delay.
- The theme of this year's convention is "Behold the maidservant of the Lord! Let it be to me according to your word". Homilies at the divine services will be based on this theme and we urge everyone to be in Chicago to hear these inspirational words and to prepare to work together for a very bright future.

THE SYNAXARION

On March 2 in the Holy Orthodox Church, we commemorate Martyr Hesychios the Senator; Theodotos, bishop of Cyrene in Cyprus; and Virgin-martyr Euthalia of Sicily. On this day, we make remembrance of the exile of the first-fashioned, Adam, from the Paradise of delight.

Verses

Let the world mourn bitterly along with ages past; As, by sweet eating, it hath fallen along with those who had fallen.

It is the Sunday of Forgiveness, known also as Cheese Fare Sunday. Today's lesson from the Holy Gospel teaches us about forgiveness and fasting, and how both are crucial to our own return to Paradise. The divine Fathers also set the anniversary of the exile of Adam from the Paradise of bliss on this day, at the entrance of Great Lent, to show us by deed as well as word how great is the benefit that accrues to man from fasting and repenting; and, on the contrary, how great the harm that comes from destructive gluttony and from disobedience to the divine commandments. The sin of gluttony resulted in Adam and Eve's banishment from Paradise, because they disobeyed God by eating from the tree which He had forbidden them. The Church reminds us of this event to encourage us to return to that ancient glory and primeval happiness by means of fasting and obedience to God and His commandments.

By Thine ineffable compassion, O Christ our God, make us worthy of the delight of Paradise and have mercy on us, as Thou art alone the Lover of mankind. Amen.
